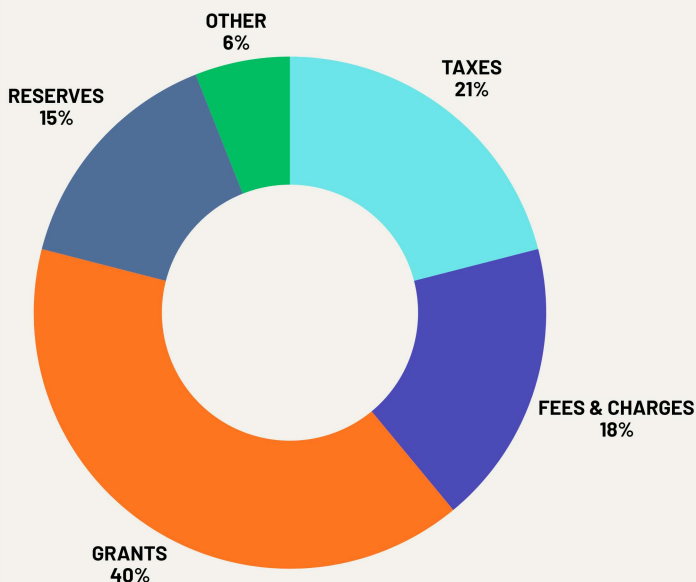

2026 TAX RATES

Uniform Mill Rate - 5 mills

Base Tax - \$520 (increase of \$120 per property)
Mill Rate Factor - 1.1 (no increase)

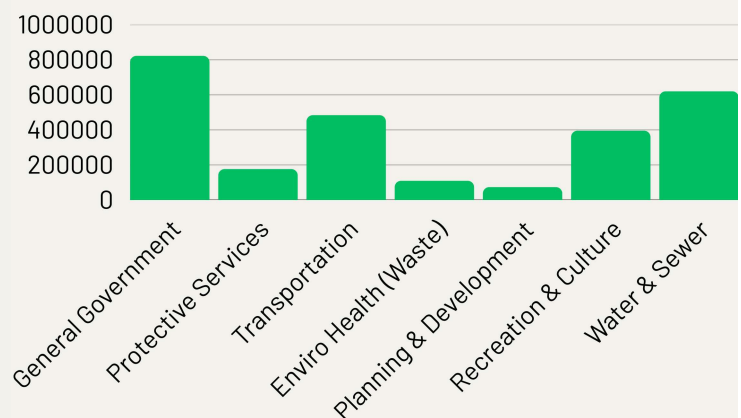
Commercial

Base Tax - \$820 (increase of \$120 per property)
Mill Rate Factor - 1.25 (no increase)

Water, Sewer & Waste Fees

Currently:

- Water & Sewer Fees cover 72% of the cost to operate the water & sewer systems
- Waste Fees cover 71% of the expenses that deal with waste.
- This means over \$80,000 of the tax dollars collected will be subsidizing utilities.

Moving Forward:

Continuing to move towards a user pay system, utility fees will be increasing over the next 2 years (2026 and 2027). The increase for January 2026 is approx. \$30 per single family household per quarter or \$10 per month.

Additionally, the Village is considering Water Metering upgrades.

Water metering benefits can include water conservation, billing fairness and accuracy, cost reductions, leak detection identification, demand management and reporting, and cost savings for water efficiency.

Sewage Lagoon Upgrades

- Sewage from the Village ends up in the regional lagoon system which is in need of upgrades estimated at over \$30 Million.
- Continuing from September 2024, an Infrastructure Levy in the amount of \$26 is added to each utility account quarterly to help cover the cost of our share of the Sewage Lagoon Upgrades project.

Recreation & Culture

The Village is proud to offer a wide variety of recreational and cultural assets that enrich the quality of life for residents and visitors to our area. Our municipality maintains and invests in park spaces, playgrounds, and outdoor sporting facilities, such as ball diamonds, a lighted football/soccer field, cross-country ski trails, the Heritage Trail, a splash park, a public beach, two public docks, and a toboggan hill. These amenities provide opportunities for year-round activity, wellness and community connection. Our inclusive Summer Recreation Program for children provides safe and fun activities that encourage our young people to learn, grow and build friendships.

In 2026, the Village remains committed to supporting a diverse range of recreational and cultural opportunities that reflect the interests of all age groups and cultural backgrounds. We welcome everyone to enjoy our amenities in the belief that recreation and culture are vital to fostering physical health, mental wellness and social connection.

The Village of Air Ronge **Bylaw 2025-05 Animal Control Bylaw**, came into effect December 16, 2025. In accordance with this bylaw, all dogs (including service and police working dogs) and cats are required to be licensed. Permanent animal licenses and their corresponding tag issued under this Bylaw are issued **at no cost and will remain valid for the lifetime of the animal.**

To complete the licensing process, please provide all requested information in the form below, along with a recent photo of your animal to our office. Your cooperation helps us keep our community safe and assists in the prompt return of lost animals to their owners.

Dog Licensing

3. Every person or owner of a dog that keeps a dog, including service or police working dogs, within the boundaries of the Village shall obtain a license from the Administrator.
 - a. The license shall be obtained within (30) thirty days of taking possession of the dog.
 - b. Every owner of a dog who resides in the Village for more than (30) thirty days in a calendar year shall obtain a license for each dog that is six (6) months of age or older.
 - c. An application for a Dog license under this Bylaw shall be submitted to the Village office. The application will be submitted on a form provided by the Administrator to include a physical description of the dog, a recent photo of the dog as an attachment, and the name, address and contact information of the owner of the dog.
 - d. When issuing a license for a dog, the Administrator shall supply the applicant with a license tag and a receipt for the license fee.
4. Every dog license and corresponding tag issued under this Bylaw is issued free of charge and shall be valid for the lifetime of the Dog.
5. Every Dog license and corresponding license tag issued under this Bylaw is valid only in respect of the Dog for which it was issued, as described on the license application. However, a license and tag may be transferred to another Dog provided the Village approved form (or notification) is submitted to the Village Office.
6. If a dog license tag is lost or damaged so as to be illegible, the owner, possessor, or harbinger of the dog to which the license was issued shall obtain a replacement which shall be issued by the Village upon payment of a fee of \$10.00.
7. Every person to whom a license has been issued under this Bylaw shall cause his or her dog to wear a collar, harness or other suitable device, to which shall be attached the license tag issued by the Village pursuant to this Bylaw, except where the dog can be identified by means of an approved microchip and the microchip number has been provided to the municipality.

Cat Licensing

8. Every person or owner of a cat that keeps a cat within the boundaries of the Village shall obtain a license from the Administrator.
 - a. The license shall be obtained within (30) thirty days of taking possession of the cat.
 - b. Every owner of a cat who resides in the Village for more than (30) thirty days in a calendar year shall obtain a license for each cat that is six (6) months of age or older.
 - c. An application for a Cat license under this Bylaw shall be submitted to the Village office. The application will be submitted on a form provided by the Administrator to include a physical description of the cat, a recent photo of the cat as an attachment, and the name, address and contact information of the owner of the cat.
 - d. When issuing a license for a cat, the Administrator shall supply the applicant with a license tag and a receipt for the license fee.
9. Every cat license and corresponding tag issued under this Bylaw shall be issued free of charge and is valid for the lifetime of the cat.
10. Every cat license and corresponding license tag issued under this Bylaw is valid only in respect of the cat for which it was issued, as described on the license application. However, a license and tag may be transferred to another cat provided the Village approved form (or notification) is submitted to the Village Office.
11. If a cat license tag is lost or damaged so as to be illegible, the owner, possessor, or harbinger of the cat to which the license was issued shall obtain a replacement which shall be issued by the Village upon payment of a fee of \$10.00.
12. Every person to whom a license has been issued under this Bylaw shall cause his or her cat to wear a collar, harness or other suitable device, to which shall be attached the license tag issued by the Village pursuant to this Bylaw, except where the cat can be identified by means of an approved microchip and the microchip number has been provided to the municipality.

1. The online Mass Notification Registration form is fillable; please fill out your information. The form requests Email Address or Phone (please specify as shown in the diagram below). Please also provide your street address. Once the street address is selected, the other information will pre-populate. Read the text message agreement (if applicable) and the Privacy Policy and check the box to confirm agreement.

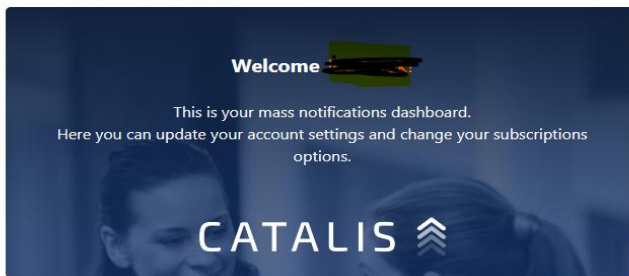
