BYLAW NO. 307-2021

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE OPERATION AND CONTROL OF SNOWMOBILES AND ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

The Council of the Northern Village of Air Ronge in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. TITLE

1.1 This Bylaw may be cited as the “Snowmobile and ATV Bylaw”

2. PURPOSE

2.1 The purpose of this bylaw is to establish regulations for the operation of snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles within the corporate boundaries of the Northern Village of Air Ronge.

3. INTERPRETATION:

For the purposes of this bylaw:

- (a) “Snowmobile(s) or ATV(s)” shall mean any duly registered motorized vehicle designed with a primary purpose of moving people or goods across unprepared surfaces and includes, but is not limited to:
 - (i) Snowmobiles as defined by *The Snowmobile Act*;
 - (ii) All terrain vehicles as defined by *The All Terrain Vehicles Act*, including but not limited to:
 - a. Dirt bikes and snow bikes;
 - b. Three or four wheeled all-terrain vehicles;
 - c. Side-by-side all terrain vehicles; and
 - (iii) Golf carts

4. USE OF MUNICIPAL ROADS AND PROPERTY

- (a) Subject to the provisions of *The Snowmobile Act*, *The All Terrain Vehicle Act*, and to any subsequent section of this bylaw, a Snowmobile or ATV operator may utilize any street, avenue or crescent within the Village of Air Ronge only for the purpose of being the most direct route from his/her residence to the limits of the Village of Air Ronge;
- (b) While operating a Snowmobile or ATV in accordance with section 2(a) of this bylaw, a Snowmobile or ATV operator shall not exceed a speed of 20 kilometres per hour;
- (c) While operating a Snowmobile or ATV in accordance with section 2(a) of this bylaw, a Snowmobile or ATV operator shall not engage in any manner of stunting;
- (d) Use of Snowmobile(s) and ATV(s) within designated municipal parks is prohibited.

5. HOURS OF OPERATION

- (a) A Snowmobile or ATV may be operated only between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. and creating no more noise than is required for regular operation.

6. SPECIAL EVENTS AND PERMITS

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of this bylaw, Council may, subject to any terms and conditions that the Council may impose, issue a permit for a specific snowmobile event.

5. EMERGENCY SERVICES

- (a) The provisions of this bylaw do not apply to a R.C.M.P. officer when engaged in the performance of his/her duties.

6. **PENALTIES**

- (a) Every person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$1,000.00

7. **REPEAL**

- (a) Bylaw No. 258/11 is hereby repealed.

8. **COMING INTO FORCE**

- (a) This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the date of final passing.
